suffering from deck and cockpit delaminations. We'll attempt to repair the worst cases for this season but it's

time to put together a plan to replace the fleet.

The key to any plan is fund raising and we're examining multiple alternatives. Last year's raffle was a modest success but without the generosity of the winners who donated their proceeds to the program we would have barely broken even. We've thought of trying less expensive tickets but this requires a greater volume. Given the supporting population a different format isn't likely to produce the revenue we need. We also think minimizing the Labor Day Auction as we did last year is the right direction. Our current thoughts on attacking the financial aspect of this problem is to establish a multiple year Laser Replacement Fund. With final status as a non-profit organization donations become legal tax deductions. In the coming weeks we will establish goals, both financial and schedule, and come up with a way to raise the money. Between sponsor-ships and private donations we hope to replace the two worst boats next year and the entire fleet in the years to follow.

from Dave Perry There is no more "Mast Abeam". Before the starting signal, leeward boats (L) can always sail up to head to wind even when overlapped with a windward boat (W) by only a couple of feet. After the starting signal., L can also sail up to head to wind regardless of W's position unless L establishes the leeward overlap from clear astern. In that case, L can't sail above her proper course during the overlap (as it was in the previous rules).

Rule Change Overview

Leeward boats can no longer luff as suddenly and as fast as they please. Now when L luffs, she must give W "room" (i.e. space and time) to keep clear of her. Windward boats still need to act promptly so L will still be able to luff fairly quickly. This requirement is exactly the same both before and after the starting signal.

When a boat is involved in contact that causes any damage at all, and she could have reasonably avoided it, she can be penalized. Also, boats (including right of way boats) can do a "720" to absolve themselves when they break this rule. Give-way boats (P and W) can now seek redress if they are physically damaged by a r-o-w boat in a way that significantly worsens their finishing place.
