Racing 2001

During the off-season, members of the LWSA and the WYC met on several occasions to coordinate their respective plans for this summer's racing program. The schedule shown above is the collective plan of both clubs. The basic program includes three "Island Races", the Michelob Cup, Jimmy Fund, and Cold Duck Race, and three "Buoy Racing" Regattas, the Commodore's Cup, August TBD, and the Labor Day Regatta. Weekly racing will again be available. Wednesday night will feature dinghy racing for our juniors. Thursday night is designated for One Design racing with the J80 fleet once again planning to race. Friday night will provide a venue for open racing using the PHRF handicap system.

The remaining open dates through the summer are available for you, as LWSA members to come forward with ideas,

plans, and the execution of any event you feel will be of interest. The LWSA assets (boats, marks, scoring program), race committee (if required), and insurance coverage would be available to you. The LWSA Board, for liability reasons, would have to approve the content of any such event plan. It would be expected that all costs for the event would be covered through participation fees, donations, and/or corporate sponsors. At this point in time, members of J80 fleet #1 and J24 fleet #140 have committed to run this year's J Jamboree North in September. We also expect Fay's Boat Yard to sponsor and run the fall Cruiser's Race. Tom Mullen has indicated an intent to schedule a Splash and Dash weekend of sailing and golf. Please come forward with your plan and we will fill the calendar.

The Geological History of the Lakes Region to be presented at the LSWA Spring Party and Annual Meeting May 12, 2001

The Lake Winnepesaukee Sailing Association, Inc. will hold its Annual Meeting and election of officers on Saturday, May 12, in conjunction with a "SAIL 2001 Party" at Gunstock Inn, Tavern & Fitness Center on Route 11A in Gilford, NH. (See Announcement on back page).

The agenda will be brief and will include a Treasurer's Report, election of Officers for 2001, and a report on the Youth Sailing School.

Our speaker will be Jim Vernon of Sandwich, NH. Jim has accumulated a time line history of the geological development of our lakes region. His presentation, titled *Geology of the Lakes Region*, will use a time line of the months, days, and hours of a full year to compare to the complete geological

history of the earth and especially of our lakes and mountains. Needless to say, most of what we see around us today has taken place on the "last day" of the "time line year".

LWSA Plans Broad Reach Alternative

For 13 years the LWSA has published *The Broad Reach* and mailed it to our members, former members, and many non-members. The goal has been to inform people interested in sailing about events, results, and information important to those who sail on Lake Winnepesaukee.

Carefully considering the large cost of printing, postage, and volunteer time required to produce *The Broad Reach* as a monthly publication, the LWSA Board has decided that this year we will provide information about our organization, its activities, notice of races, scores and results, and Youth Sailing activities via email and our web site, www.lwsa.org

In addition to the information we will be posting on the web page, we are compiling an e-mail address file of all LWSA members. Over 90% of current members have provided their e-mail addresses so that we can send out announcements to all members on a timely basis. This should provide an effective communication method for us to plan, carry out, and report on activities throughout the year. Be sure to include your e-mail address on your 2001 registration form and send it in right away so you will be on the e-mail distribution list. If you do not have email and are a member, we will mail you whatever items we email.

Thirdly, the Board recently approved the installation of a Voice Mail mailbox service from local telephone provider, Verizon. The Home Voice Mail telephone will allow us to place a greeting, make announcements, and provide instruction for callers to either contact others or leave a message. We will be using the line actively during the Youth Sailing School registration period to help parents get their children enrolled. The

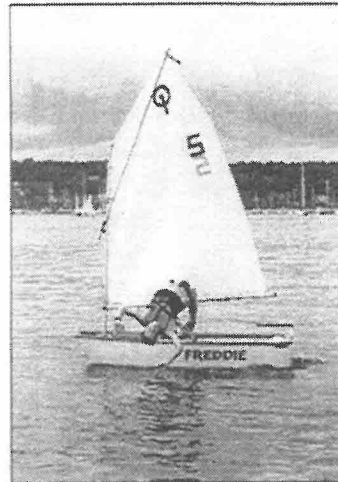

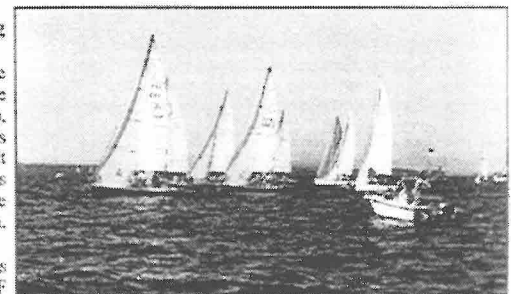
Youth Sailing School

Invitation: The Winnepesaukee Yacht Club is pleased to invite all sailors to the 2001 Friday Night Series.

Eligibility: The regatta is open to any skipper or owner who wishes to participate. Participants must meet all regatta requirements and must have paid all event fees before becoming official competitors.

Rules: This regatta will be governed by the *2001-2004 Racing Rules of Sailing* (RROS) including US Sailing Prescriptions, this notice (except as modified by the Sailing Instructions), and the Sailing Instructions.

Scoring: The Low Point Scoring System (Appendix A2) will be used.

Entry: Each entry must be submitted on the form for the race (may be obtained at sign up or by calling Ed Philpot at 603-528-2900). The entry fee for a single evening is \$5 by cash or check payable to the Winnepesaukee Yacht Club (WYC). Pay at the start line.

Site: The races will be buoy and island races and will take place either in the area known as "The Broads" or the area known as "Sanders Bay"

Notice of Race - Sunday May 27, 2001 24th ANNUAL MICHELOB CUP "Race for the Ribbon"

1. Organizing Authority: LWSA

2. Rules: The race will be governed by the *Racing Rules of Sailing 2001-2004*, the prescriptions of US Sailing, the rules of PHRF New England for monohulls, the corresponding class rules for catamarans, and the sailing instructions as modified by this notice of race and verbally at the skipper's meeting.

3. Entries: The regatta is open to any boat which qualifies under the forementioned rules. Registration is between 0900 and 1100 on May 27, 2001 at Fay's Boatyard. Each entry must be submitted on the form for the race at sign up. The entry fee for keelboats is \$40 by cash or check payable to NH Distributors (includes T-Shirts for crew up to 4). Catamaran fee is \$20 per boat (includes 2 T-Shirts). This is a charity event with the proceeds to benefit the LWSA Youth Sailing Program.

4. Sailing Instructions: The 2001 Combined LWSA/WYC sailing instructions shall be used and will be available at registration.

5. Course: The race will be an island race as described in the Sailing Instructions. The course will be posted at the skipper's meeting.

6. The Start: This is a "reverse start" event. Boats are handicapped at the skipper's meeting and issued individual "delay times" based on the course length and PHRF (monohull) or Sullivan/portsmouth (catamaran) handicap factor. After the starting signal, individual boats will start after their "delay time" has elapsed.

7. Bonus "Delay Time": Any Boat that sponsors a skipper and their boat that has never participated in this race before shall be granted a one minute reduction in their "Delay Time" start. The new participant shall also receive a one minute reduction from their "Delay Time" start.

8. The Finish: Boats will be assigned a finishing place corresponding to the order in which they finish.

9. Schedule:

10. Awards: Prizes will be awarded to the top three in monohull racing, monohull cruising, and catamaran class.

Why should you consider the donation of your Boat to the LWSA?

The Federal Government recognizes that gifts to religious, education, charitable, scientific, and literary organizations have contributed significantly to the welfare of our nation and our tax laws encourage such giving. You are entitled to take a charitable contribution deduction, subject to certain conditions and limitations, on your income tax return for genuine gifts of cash or property to qualified organizations. The LWSA is such an organization.

Personal property, such as your boat, that is donated to a charity is tax deductible for its full value if the property's use is related to the charity's exempt function. LWSA would use your boat for our stated boating purposes. The gift's value would help underwrite the cost of teaching sailing to young people, and help them attend regional and national competitions. Participation in training programs furthers the sport that we all share together. All the funds that we receive are invested in our program that teaches children from 8 to 16 to learn to sail and enjoy our lake in an environmentally friendly way.

Some examples of support derived from funds to our Youth Sailing Program are:

Boat Purchases - Funds are used for the purchase of junior training boats and maintenance of our existing fleet.

Support - of youth participation in men's and women's regional and Olympic sailing events

Scholarships - for students of our program who cannot afford the full tuition.

The mechanics of a boat contribution are relatively simple. We have a com-

plete package of documents and explanations. The owner signs the title and/or registration on the back of the documentation where the word Seller appears and signs a Deed of Gift. The LWSA has the experience in handling boat contributions and can assist with paperwork preparation. Generally, if your boat's donation value exceeds \$5,000, you will need to obtain a qualified appraisal and attach IRS Form 8283, "Qualified Appraisal Summary", to your tax return. LWSA strongly recommends that any boat owner considering a contribution to consult their tax advisor.

This program has been in use at numerous other sailing organizations over the country for a number of years. We have been able to review material on the program provided to us through our affiliation with the Northeast Sailing Association and US Sailing. LWSA can realize a significant source of funds to support our sailing program and you the donor can be relieved of the considerable expense of continued boat ownership, the hassle of storing and selling the boat, realize a tax saving deduction, and, above all, make a real contribution toward our mutual goal of supporting our sport of sailing. A pamphlet containing information about the donation of your boat to the LWSA is available. A publicity campaign is also planned to solicit the general public for boat donations.

We can utilize boats of all sizes and can even handle power boats. We have recently accepted donations from a Sunfish sailing dinghy to a Capri 25 keelboat and even an Four Winns power boat. We welcome your contribution.
