#### 1993 Sailing Schedule Highlights ... by Ray Lanza

On the following page of this issue is the 1993 Sailing Schedule. Our season begins with a few hours of your graciously appreciated work on May 8. We need as many hands as we can get to prepare the Youth Sailing Boats for the season. The fun begins with a dinner and seminar on high tech sail making given by Hallett Sails, our 1993 Series sponsor. The dinner and seminar are being held at B. Mae's, space is limited to 25, so sign-up now.

Last season we experimented with the series schedule in an attempt to meet the needs of those who couldn't or didn't want to devote Sunday's to racing. We wound up with the same boats racing in both series so this season we've returned to a more normal format. The series will be run on 7 Sundays throughout the summer with an 8th Sunday reserved as a makeup day. As usual we'll run two buoy races for the spinnaker classes and one island race for cruisers. Scoring will be time on time. A valid 1993 PHRF certificate is a requirement. No yacht will be scored without one. You can find a series sign-up form in this issue of the *Broad Reach*. If you have not yet received your 1993 PHRF application form contact me. Please mail or deliver them to me on or before May 16th.

We have two marathon events this year, The Long Distance Challenge and the Around The Lake Race. Seymour Friedel is the RCOD for both events and he assures me that we'll have even more fun than in the past. The first race, the Long Distance Challenge is a daytime event. #### PHRF News

...Ray Lanza

The Spring Meeting was held this month at the Savin Hill Yacht Club in Boston. The most notable news for the year is *Recreational Handicaps*.

The purpose of *Recreational* Handicaps is to promote participation of cruising yachts by recognizing the racing disadvantage of typical cruising gear. A boat equipped with non high-tech sails and working roller furling gear will get an additional 6 seconds on it's rating. The headsail must be attached to the normal swivel and roller furling drum. The handicap does not apply to yachts using a split drum system where the furling gear is by passed. The one change to the inventory rule applies. The 6 seconds is applied to the base handicap which means that it affects both the spinnaker and non-spinnaker rating of the yacht. More detailed information will be sent with your PHRF application.

The other significant change to the handicap rules involve the use of multiple headsails and whisker poles on a sloop competing in cruising classes. A sloop **may not** fly more than one headsail at a time. If a whisker pole is used it may not be longer than the J dimension and must be used on the opposite side of the boat from the boom. In the past this rule has been part of the local sailing instructions in Marblehead and other areas (we added it last year). It's now an official part of the PHRF bylaws.

The final change is that restrictions on the use of asymmetrical spinnakers have been dropped. This sail is now just another spinnaker and may be used with or without a pole.


There are 16 clubs or associations that comprise the PHRF-NE Fleet. Last year we had 39 registered yachts which puts our fleet just about in the middle sizewise. There were actually twice that many boats that raced at least a couple of events. If all the boats that raced last year signed up we would have one of the largest fleets in New England! PHRF works if you participate! We've been able to influence the ratings of 3 boats but I need your support.

The Labor Day Regatta will be the official *New Hampshire PHRF Championship*. Please support this effort by registering your boat this year!

#### Youth Sailing Club Announced For Kids 13 - 16 ... by Sandy Mackey

The Youth Sailing Program is very pleased to announce the creation of a Youth Sailing Club. This concept was only an aspiration last year, but with the help and support of the Winnipesaukee Yacht Club and Fay's Boat Yard, we hope to see competitive racing for kids a mainstay on the Lake.

This program was prompted by the students who have participated in our sailing program for the past few years. Many of them are now in a Level 3 class and are asking what more can we do. Toward this aim, we began taking small groups of kids to competitions within the New England district last year. Their enthusiasm was heightened.

This past winter, we have been in contact with the heads of the youth sailing programs from Maine, Vermont, New Hampshire



and Massachusetts. We have joined the Maine Yacht Racing Association as a means to be included in program decisions governing inter-club racing.

The specific details are at this time still being formulated. However, our intent is to offer periodic Saturday clinics which will be under the guidance of a training coach. At these clinics the kids will learn how to properly race their boats. Each student coming out of our sailing program has learned the essentials of sailing, but in the clinics offered by the club, we will now teach them racing techniques that they will need to know if they wish to compete on an inter-club level.

We are coordinating with the clubs within the New England District to set up invitational racing events. The club will travel to other states to participate and they will also host events here on the Lake.

This is a great opportunity for the kids to meet other kids and gain an appreciation for sailing in other types of conditions other than those we have on the Lake.

To participate in the club, a individual must be between the ages of 13 & 16. They should have obtained a Level 3 standard within our sailing program, or be able to demonstrate to the Coach an ability that would qualify them for consideration into the program.

More details on the activities will be mailed to all Level 3 students within the next few weeks. If someone is interested and is not on our mailing list, but would like to be considered, please contact Sandra Mackey at 603-487-2677 for more details.
