

Laser Series: Scheduled on Wednesday evenings for anyone young or old who would like to join the fun. The LWSA fleet of boats will be available for use to members of the LWSA on a first come first serve basis. The members of the LWSA Youth Sailing Club will have first option on the boats as this time will be used as a coaching time for the club.

One Design: Open to any two boats of the same class on Thursday evenings. Great opportunity to practice and further perfect your starts, mark rounding, crew coordination etc.

WYC Evening Series: Virtually every Friday Evening, with a 6 PM start. Join the rest of the racers at 5 PM for a beer and quick skippers meeting.

Spring Series: Scheduled for virtually every Sunday with a 1230 start. If the enclosed questionnaire indicates considerable interest in an earlier start and of course, an earlier finish, we could change the start time. We have redesigned the courses to minimize the waiting time between races; thereby, permitting at least three races versus the normal two of last year. *Continued Page 4*

J/22, J/24, J/27, Capri 22 and 25's, Puddlejumper 30's, Melges 24's, come out and enjoy the purest form of sailboat racing where the skill of the crew determines the outcome instead of a slide rule. Thursday evenings on the lake offer the advantages of significantly less motorboat wake, steady evening breezes, the chance to get in some quality racing without dedicating an entire weekend on the race course. Get that 'ol buddy' with the same boat that thinks he's twice as fast upwind and put the fiberglass on the triangle for a strategic match race. Improve you speed, boat handling, and racing tactics in the real time formatofone design racing. It doesn't matter what type of boat you sail as long as there is a minimum of two boats in your class, spinnaker or non-spinnaker. Racing begins promptly as 1800 southwest of Welch Island on May 19th. A \$25.00 fee payable to the LWSA (chase boat fuel) is all that's required for an entire season of summer evening races. 

ciation) district, of which the LWSA is a member. The MYRA area encompasses Maine, New Hampshire and Vermont. The LWSA championship will be held on July 9, at the WYC. The winner of this championship will go on to Bristol, RI on July 25,26 to compete in the Area A Championships. The winner of that competition will then represent Area A at the national US Sailing/Rolex Leiter Cup in Rochester NY, August 5-9.

What is the Smythe Cup? The Smythe Cup is open to all juniors between the ages of 13-18. This is a single-handed Laser race. Each club within the three districts, (southern, central and eastern) of MYRA will have an elimination race. The top three winners from each club will be sent to the regional championships. The LWSA will be hosting the southern area regional championship on July 16-17 at the WYC. The top four winners from each region will then compete for the State Championships on July 28,29. The winner will then compete at the Area A Championship in Newport RI on August 1,2. The final winner will represent Area A at the US Sailing Rolex National Championship at Charleston, SC Aug 11-16.

What does this mean to the LWSA? This allows us an opportunity to participate for the first time in a Junior Racing event which will eventually culminate on the national level. Juniors from all over the northern New England area will be coming to our lake to compete and share in our sailing experience.

What do we need? In order for this to be successful we need help. One person, or a small number of people can not do it all. There are kids to feed and possibly house, we need race committee boat crews, judges, someone to handle publicity, sponsorship and the list goes on. What do we need? We need is YOU!

This is an opportunity for you to work with a great group of people who all share in the love of sailing and can help promote sailing to the young people who will be there to compete. Here's an opportunity for you to help out and not tie up your entire summer. We will be having a brainstorming meeting on Friday, May 27th at 7:30 PM at Fays Rec Room.
