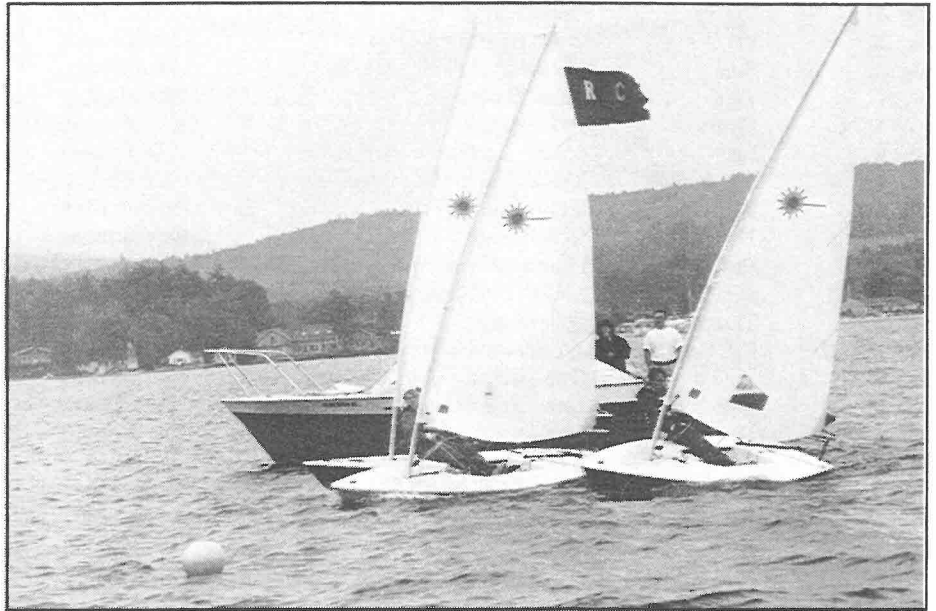

Despite these developments, I feel that this season is off to a slow start and there are some developments within the Association that I feel need to be addressed.

First and foremost, it has come to my attention that some members of the organization have concerns about the schedule as it has been published. I understand that many are concerned with the lack of social events written into the sailing schedule. This issue was discussed at the organizational meeting held at the Margate in May, and at that time those concerns were not voiced.

I should note, however, that in looking at the schedule, there are many available dates for the schedule of cruising, racing and/or social events. My ideas include a possible Cruise to Nowhere that would be a sail to some destination on the Lake not normally cruised to by our members, for the purposes of enjoying the scenery and a good fellowship and perhaps rafting for lunch and a swim.

Time Bandit Takes 4th at J/27 North Americans Leiter Cup State Championships

Time Bandit and her crew of LWSA Members attracted even more attention than her fourth place finish would indicate. She was the only boat in the first seven that did not have professional sail makers onboard. The top boat was using the new one piece 3DL sails.

Alan Kanegsberg along with crew members Helane, Phil, Bob and Mary Knowles, Jason Blais and Linda Mackey, trailered Time Bandit 500 miles to the Buffalo Harbor YC on Lake Erie to compete in the national event June 10, 11.

Another idea is to have an informally established, heavily handicapped race to a destination such as Wolfboro or Meredith. In this race, handicaps will be assigned to the faster boats, that would double or triple the normal handicap and afford the opportunity for some of the more purely cruising-oriented boats to be competitive. This idea might be expanded to include an overnight stay in Meredith as it is my understanding that Chris Rich has had conversation with Meredith Selectmen that might result in allowing the Fleet to stay overnight at the dock.

Yet another idea is to have a series of small, on-water, racing or spinnaker sailing clinics. These clinics might get some cruising members on to racing boats so that they can practice sailing with spinnakers and possibly learn a little bit more about racing tactics and rules.

Frankly, I need your help. We each bring different backgrounds to this job, and I can't do much to change mine. What I need are your ideas

and your support. I commit to you that I'll work to build these ideas into the schedule. But I also need your efforts to make these plans successful.

You will recall that I stated in my original Commodore's Message that I would try to do my best in this job, despite my commitments. Obvious, I have not yet been successful. Furthermore, I indicated in my original letter that this is our organization and that participation on the part of everyone would be required to make it successful. I hope that after receiving and reviewing this letter, some of you who have problems will contact me directly to discuss them. I am greatly distressed that only one person, Chris Rich, has come forward to discuss this matter with me. I have listened to Chris and I have agonized over the issues that he has present, and I am trying my level best to come up with some solutions to keep him and others like him activity involved in the organization.

Let all of you be assured that there is no international slight against anyone in this organization,

regardless of his or her orientation.

I admit and confess wholeheartedly that I am a die-hard sailboat racer. Racing is a sport for me. I live close to my boat and sailboat racing is the functional equivalent of playing softball. I go to my boat, I race, and I go home. I have thus far not been involved in cruising or social aspects of the organization because I have other aspects of the organization because I have other interest and responsibilities and I need to limit the type and amount of time that I devote to my "obsessions" and likewise to afford my family the opportunity to do other things.

This does not mean that I am not sensitive to the needs of other persons within the organization, nor does it mean that I am not willing to listen. I would probably even participate in some of these events if anyone were crazy enough to invite me, my wife and three small children. (It is also obvious and should go without stating that the J/24 is not a comfortable cruising craft for a family of the nature and composition of mine).

If you have a problem with the organization, I fully expect that you will tell me about it as forcefully and directly as you possibly can, however, I further expect that you will be prepared to be part of the solution.

Please do not allow the tone of this letter to offend you. It is written out of my commitment to this organization and my concern for its future health. I expect that you will as forcefully and directly convey your concerns to me as I have mine to you. Ed Philpot, July 11, 1994

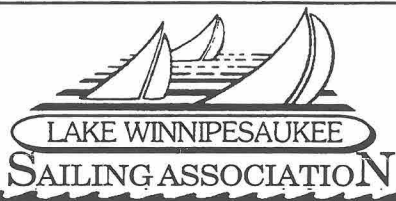

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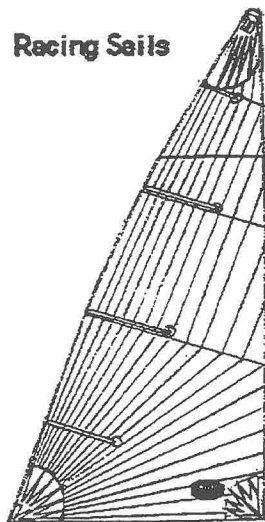

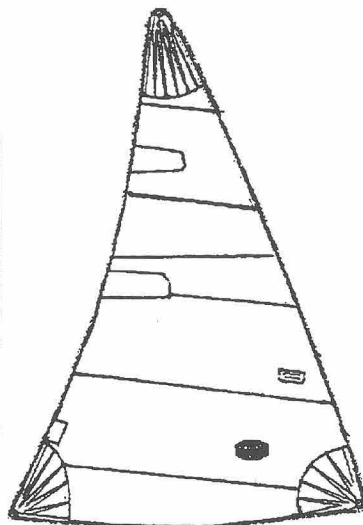

Smythe Cup Southern Regional Regatta

This year, the LWSA was asked to host the Smythe Southern Regional Regatta. This is the first regatta, among many regattas, that a Junior Laser sailor must attend if they are to compete in the Rolex National Championship, held this year in Charleston, South Carolina. The event is open to all Junior Laser sailors within the southern Maine Yacht Racing Association district.

Each club can send three entrants to the event. The top four finishers then go on to compete in the MYRA district event, which includes the southern, central and eastern districts. The winner of the event would then represent MYRA in the Area A championships. The final winner of the Area A championship, would then compete in the National Rolex Championship. As you can see, this event can be very complex and very challenging for the Junior Laser sailor who competes at every level.

Our event was held on July 16, at the WYC. The day began at 9:00, with registration. There were six entries, two from Portland, one from Sunapee, and three from the LWSA, Laura Mackey, Evan Mullen and Warner Nickerson. The three sailors the LWSA sent to the event were selected through a race off within the club during an evening event prior to July 16.

Dave Mackey, the Race Committee Chairman, welcomed the sailors to the lake and introduced the days events, as well as the sailing instructions for the day. At this time, the USSA Certified Judges John Tagliamonte, and the Senior Judge Dick Cheeseborough were introduced. Shortly after the Skippers Meeting the races began in Sanders Bay.

The weather for the day was sunny with winds averaging 5-10 knots. We were able to run seven races, which allowed one throughout

for each entrant. The races consisted of windward leeward, triangle and modified Olympic courses. The racing results were fairly consistent each race with the Jamie Carter of Portland finishing first in all but one race.

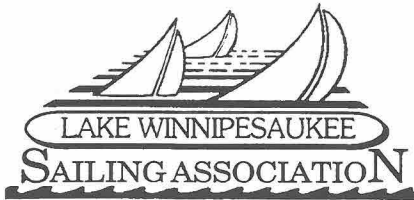

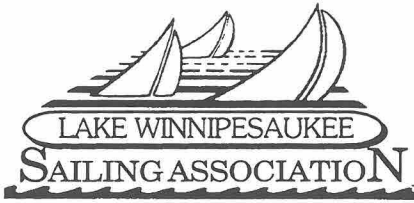
