### Youth Sailing - Starting Fast

Tri-Lake Invitational - This year, the MYRA Junior Sailing programs at Sunapee, Mascoma and Winnipesaukee have joined to together to create a Tri-Lake Invitational. Each month, one of the lakes will host a mini regatta. On June 27, the LWSA held the first regatta which proved to be very successful.

What a thrill to see 21 kids, ages 13 to 18 sailing together. We were able to gather 14 Lasers for the kids to use on a rotational basis. The day started out with a classroom type seminar given by our Head Instructor, Carter White. After lunch the fun began on the water. Several races were held with the individual coaches from each of the lakes giving tips. At the close of the day, a review of the days activities showed that the kids had a great time and were anxious for more racing. It was hoped that maybe next year we'd be able to organize more rotationals between the lakes.

Pancake Breakfast a Success-The third annual Pancake Breakfast which is run by the LWSA Junior Sailing Club, in conjunction with the Jimmy Fund Regatta, was a great success! This year we netted \$300.00. The proceeds from the breakfast help to defray the costs of our coach, traveling expenses, gasoline etc. We want to thank everyone who came to the breakfast for your support and especially all those who bought a \$10.00 cup of coffee. We really appreciate your kindness.

Our Lesson Program Continues to Grow - The 1995 season began with a well attended parent orientation in Fay's rec room on Friday night. Instructors and CIT's greeted parents, handed out information packets and offered refreshments before the program began.

After a brief history of the LWSA Youth Sailing Program and our commitment to a safe and enjoyable learning environment, Carter White and Laura Mackey, our instructors were introduced. Carter continued with introductions of the CIT's.

An outline of the levels and the appropriate texts followed. Sean Mulligan was kind enough to volunteer for a classroom demonstration of chair sailing. He passed with flying colors!

Carter entertained questions and invited all to enjoy refreshments before the meeting concluded.

(P.S. the parents continue to show their support with a highly successful first week of the new Parent of the Day Program)

This year's Youth Sailing Lesson Program is underway and well ahead of schedule. Our latest count of registrants is 89, which means there are only a few more open slots if anyone is thinking about registering don't wait. Our largest group of registrants this year has been for the Level I classes. Many of these sailors are between the ages of 8 and 13 and have never sailed before. This level has been so active, that for the first time we have a waiting list.

To aid in our expansion, we have increased our fleet of six Lasers to include six Optimists. We originally had two Optimists, and this Spring we invested in an additional four Optimists. This addition will allow us to better train our young sailors by teaching them in a safe and comfortable environment. For the first time we will also be able to spend more class time with sailing rather than with swimming lessons and capsize recovery drills since the younger kids can become more easily adapted to this size boat.

In addition, later this summer we will begin splitting one of the

I also need to correct last months column, I mistakenly left out 20/20 and her crew in the tune-up race. They finished so far ahead of everyone that I forgot that they were there. I am very sorry.

Racing - The WYC had a good turn out for the Jimmy Fund Race with more than 30 boats in attendance. The weather was great and we (racing A) had a good long downwind leg, always a pleasure. Race Chairman Derek Lewis sent us to Parker Island. The wind was good, slightly shifty and it was a nice day. Results appear elsewhere in this issue.

The next scheduled race is the WYC's Commodore's Cup. We hope to see you there. Also in this issue is the format and the Official Notice of Race for a new race; the first annual Night Owl Express and Gala Breakfast which will be sponsored by Patrick's Pub and Eatery. This event replaces the Overnight Race, with a much shorter course and a time limit so everyone can have a good night's sleep before enjoying a sumptuous breakfast/brunch at Patrick's Pub. It should be a lot of fun.

Sailing Awareness II - The second sailing awareness day was held on June 24th and turned out to be even more successful than the first. The weather was sunny and warm even though the wind was a bit spotty. The morning had more wind than the afternoon, but there were no complaints heard from the participants, who were treated to a course side view of the Hobie Regatta as well as views of our beautiful lake.

Forty six potential new sailors took advantage of our Free Sailing offer, and another 12 to 15 people either couldn't fit what was available into their schedule or we did not have enough boats available to take them. We gave out lots of literature and we hope to have gained some new members. One couple was so excited about sailing they went to talk to Sean as soon as they left the boat.

Thanks to everyone who participated, especially the skippers of the following boats, Pinocchio, Mischief Maker, Blueberry Pie, Time Bandit and Dreamer. We hope to make this an annual event in early June.

Boats - As I mentioned in the last Broad Reach the Witch Way needs a facelift. Well the facelift wasn't finished by the deadline, so we had the boat moved to Fay's Boat Yard where we feel it will be more accessible. Please pitch in and help.

The chase boat (Wellcraft) needed more repair work than originally expected. We started to reattach the rub rail, but in the process noticed that the hull and deck joint was in sad shape. So we took the joint apart and removed all the screws, refiberglassed the holes and rejoined the hull and deck. We also sealed all the through hull fittings, repaired the seat, cleaned all the junk out, repaired the cushion, fixed the radio and all the electrical accessories and lights. Then we finally purchased and installed the new rub rail, our original goal.

I would like to thank the small but dedicated crew that assisted me in this endeavor. We also received a donation from Metz Communications of a marine antenna. To see what it looks like just look on the top of your mast, you probably have one. I would also ask everyone to be careful when around any of the LWSA boats, you hate to spend money and time repairing your boat and so do we.

classes into a level one class using the Optimists, and at the same time teaching a level three class in the Lasers. By having the versitility of the two types of boats, we hope to be able to expand our program more next year by offering the levels at more times, using the dual fleets. This year's class will be a trial run to see how it works.

As our fleet has increased, so has our curriculum. This year we have broadened our program with the use of three books, one for each level. The Red Cross' Sailing Right book will be issued to each student. In addition, the students who will be using the Optimists in Level I class will use a book designed for the Optimist sailor. The Level II class which uses Lasers, will use a

book written for the Laser sailor by Tilgman. The Level III class which is focused on racing techinques will be using Dave Perry's book on Rules. These books are purchased by the students and will be used as the start of an excellent sailing library.

In addition to our registrants being active, so have our instructors. Carter has returned as our Head Instructor, after his first year at Hobart College in Geneva, New York, where he was very active on their sailing team. Laura Mackey, our new Assistant Instructor has just completed her USSA Certification for Sailing. In the Fall, she will be attending William Smith College in Geneva New York where she hopes to be a member of their sailing team. The Counselors in Training, who are members of the LWSA Youth Sailing Club, have just completed an all day seminar on how to be a counselor in training.

With all of these additions and changes, we are hoping for a very exciting year for the Youth Sailing Program.

Area A Leiter Cup to be Hosted by the LWSA - This year, we have been fortunate enough to be asked by the New England Racing Council to host the Area A Leiter Cup. This event is one step above the Regional Event we ran last year. The Area A event is open to all girls between the ages of 13 and 18 from all over the New England area. The winner of this event will go on to represent the area in the US Sailing Leiter Trophy Championship which is being held this year at the Newport Harbor Yacht Club in Balboa, California.

We are anticipating 20 women to compete and we are looking forward to excellent representation by the ladies who are members of our Youth Sailing Club, Meghan Heckman, Kyle Davis, Laura Mackey and Paige Black.

Our event will be held on July 29 in conjunction with the WYC.
