New England Junior Women's Championship

On Saturday, July 29, the LWSA hosted the 1995 New England Junior Women's Single-handed Sailing Championship for the Francis McElwain Wakeman Trophy. The morning brought fog, mist and light wind, and eight girls from all corners of New England. We had pre-registrations for 18 girls, however the severe weather in southern Mass. caused 10 girls not to show.

As the girls rigged their Lasers uncertainty lurked as to whether we would be able to get the event off. But Mother Nature took pity on us. As the girls made their way to the starting line, the winds started to pick up and the rain clouds passed to the south. The first race, a triangle course, started at 10:30. As the day went on, the weather improved, and so did the wind. We were able to complete six races allowing the girls one throw out. The courses ranged from triangles, to windward-leeward to modified Olympic courses.

The overall winner this year as well as last year was Liz Bent from Gloucester, Mass. Liz will represent Area A in the 1995 US Sailing/Rolex Junior Women's Championship for the Nancy Leiter Clagett Trophy in Balboa Calif on Aug 5.

Fred Richardson Memorial

As you look out onto Smith Cove, you may see one of our new Optimists with the name FREDDIE. On Sunday, July 23, at the WYC Commodore's Cup, the Optimist named Freddie and a plague were presented to Fred Richardson Sr. in memory of his son Fred Richardson Jr.

As many of you may know, last Fall, Fred Richardson Jr., was lost at sea in a sailing accident off the coast of Rhode Island. Fred was an avid sailor. He was raised in the Gilford area, learned how to sail at the WYC when he was young. From Gilford, he went on to crew on many boats including the "Spirit of America" in the 1987 America's Cup which was held in Fremantle, Australia. He was well respected in the sailing community. At the time of his demise, he was employed at Concordia Yachts in Rhode Island.

In the memorial for Fred, his family requested that in lieu of flowers, monies should be sent to the LWSA Youth Sailing Program. The funds collected allowed us to purchase an Optimist which

That's because we "stacked the deck". The start times are based upon PHRF times 1.5 so that the slower boats have the advantage. If a boat normally owes you a minute a mile, they now owe you 1-1/2 minutes a mile. Hot boat owners, take it as an extra challenge!

Golf Handicapping at Labor Day Regatta

"Let's give it a try!" was the comment at a recent Labor Day Regatta planning meeting. What is being tried is the Golf Handicapping system described by Ray Lanza in the May issue. It will be used only for the non-spinnaker classes in the event. It is hoped that it's success will lead to general use for both spinnaker and non-spinnaker divisions in the future.

Why only non-spinnaker classes? Two reasons. First, the PHRF point spread in this division, tends to be very wide, with boats typically ranging nearly two hundred points. Even when dividing competitors into three classes, at least one if not all three classes could

may have boats with PHRF numbers spread greater than the ideal 20 to 30 points.

A second reason is that this division typically has classes which mix heavy displacement boats which tend to be at a greater disadvantage in our light wind lake conditions with light displacement craft.

No, this change will not make a perfect racing world. However, it should give each skipper and crew a real chance of winning.
