Treasurer's Corner by Alan Kanegsberg

Looking back at 1995, it was the best year yet for our seven year old LWSA. We had one of our largest memberships and excellent attendance at our events, both on and off the water.

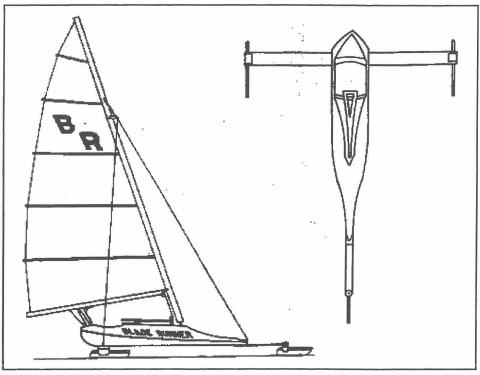
Having been Treasurer for many years, I thought that I would try to present a financial picture of the Lake Winnipesaukee Sailing Association. First of all, we are a Notfor-Profit Corporation that has 501(c)(3) status (donations are deductible).

The LWSA owns 6 Optimist Sailing Prams, 6 Lasers, a 26' 1963 Chris Craft Sea Skiff (the "Committee Boat", and an 18' Wellcraft (the "Chase Boat"). The total cost of all boats was \$31,706. We still have outstanding loans from the Village Bank for \$8,345. In addition to our boats, we own Racing equipment including marks, anchors, flags, etc to manage racing and Sailing School equipment including classroom and on water materials.

Our annual budget is about \$35,000. Sources of income include membership, school registration fees, fund raising, and sponsors.

The individual events that we run each support themselves. These include the Michelob, Night Owl Race, the fun events, Labor Day, the San Juan Regatta, and the J-Jamboree.

The Sailing School has a budget of over \$15,000 including instructors, books and supplies, fuel and boat maintenance. Its shortfall is made up by the general operations and fund raising of the LWSA.

In 1995, we totally rebuilt both the "Committee Boat" and the "Chase Boat". The cost of those two projects was over \$4,000. In addition to that, we lost the powerhead on the Wellcraft and our liability insurance for the School increased

by 50%. All of this plus the expansion of The Broad Reach to a monthly schedule used our reserve funds.

However, the Sail Awareness Program and the efforts to convince

people that supporting the LWSA promotes sailing on the Lake gave us the most members we have had in many years.

A very high percentage of our members are also members of the US Sailing Golden Anchor Membership Program. In addition to getting Sailing World Magazine at a substancial discount, these members are supporting sailing nationally.

As a not-for-profit organization, we try to keep our dues low and operate a very lean program. This usually means that minimum re-

serve funds are available at the beginning of each year when all of the planning takes place.
