Commodore's Corner

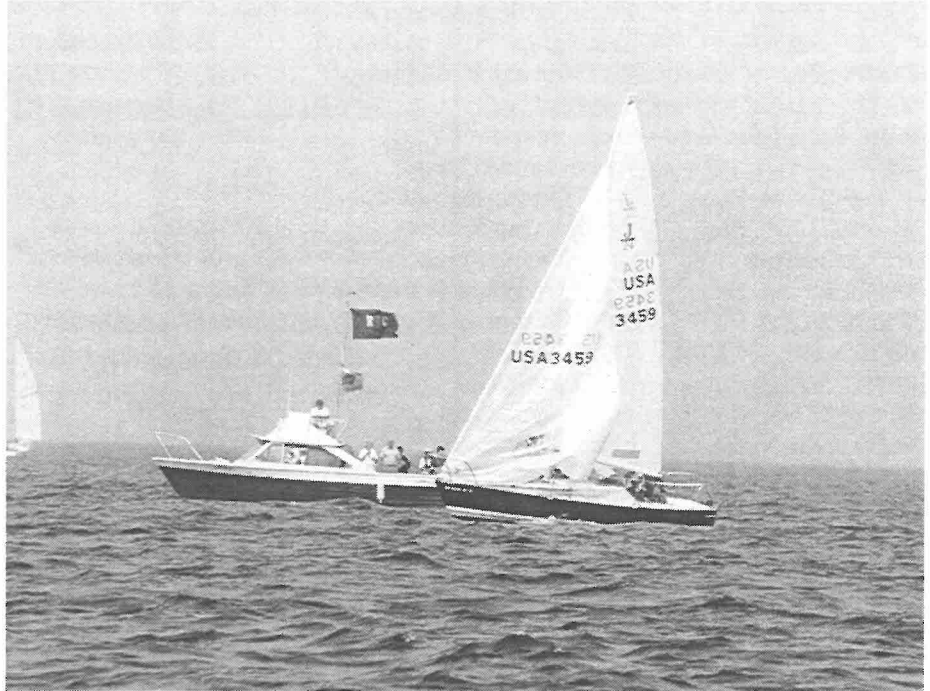

The first two events of the season, the Tune-up race and the Michelob Cup, are behind us. After complaining about the long winter we had a Tune-up race with typical August conditions, warm and no wind!! Seymour's boat, 20/20, hadn't been launched and he graciously volunteered to be race committee. With light winds he sent us on a circumnavigation of the Witches. Of the dozen or so boats that showed up only two actually finished the race. A week later we were back in the deep freeze for the Michelob Cup. It felt more like October than May with temperatures in the 50's. In spite of the weather, we had a great turnout with 42 mono-hulls and 25 catamarans, one of the largest Michelob Cups ever.

Enough complaining about weather, this month's General Meeting will be on Saturday, June 22nd. General Meetings are normally the third Friday of each month but the third weekend in June is also "Sail Awareness Day". We thought it would be a good idea to finish the day with a party so the meeting is moved to Sat. If the weather is good, we'll supply burgers for a cookout on the main dock at Fay's. If the weather isn't great the meeting will be in the Rec. Room and we'll order pizza.

The next major event is the Jimmy Fund Race. It's normally an island race that starts and finishes in front of the WYC in Sander's Bay. This event is a lot of fun and a great opportunity to introduce new sailors to racing. If you're docked beside or moored near someone who normally

J-Boats Score Big in 19th Annual Michelob Cup

After a Saturday of 25-30 knot winds, Sunday morning began with calm wind conditions. Was this to be a Memorial Day "floaters"? Fears were soon put to rest as winds began to build into the teens from the northwest for this near record size fleet.

As usual RCOD Terry Pratt had things well organized and the fleet went off on schedule under the guidance of Race Committee Chief John Goodhue.

More than 70 boats were registered with a record size Multihull class pushing total numbers to a near record for the event. The fleet headed upwind from a starting line south of Welch Island. Leaving Welch to starboard, the fleet reached to Middle Ground Shoal then gybed toward a starboard rounding of Dia-

mond Island. After partaking of a goodly portion of Diamond Island's usual challenging wind shifts, the fleet headed upwind and home.

Repeating in the winners circle for a second straight year in the Racing Class was Casey Nickerson, this year aboard his J24 Good Stuff. Just behind was the Kanegsberg crew on the J27 Time Bandit, and in third

place was the J80 Blues Power skippered by Bob Lemire.

In the Non-spinnaker class the Destrempe's new J40 Resolve edged out a two second victory over the prerenial winners Ray and Helen Lanza in their Pearson 31 Impetuous. Also collecting some Michelob hardware in third place was Nightfly

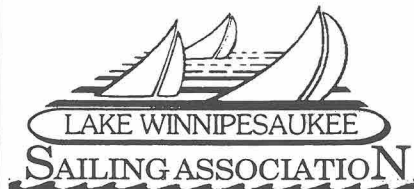

Sailing Awareness Day

Its time again for Sailing Awareness Day. This is our second annual Sailing Awareness event, a day in which we promote sailing opportunities on the lake. Last year we had a good turn out and I have already had three calls from interested new sailors regarding this year's event. We will be holding it on Saturday June 22 from 9 AM to 4 PM.

Why do we hold Sailing Awareness Day? The charter of the LWSA is to promote the sport of sailing. From our youth sailing program, to the races we organize and run, to the Broad Reach, our goal is to promote sailing. As part of this goal we want to introduce new people to the sport. How many people have you heard say that they wanted to learn more about sailing but never had the chance. Well this is their chance. Some of last year's participants had crewed on other boats, some had small boats and wanted to try a big

boat. Others had never sailed before. Several became interested and joined the Sail NH Program. Others enrolled their children in our Youth Sailing Program.


We need your help (this seems to be a recurring theme in my articles). Boats will be needed to take people out. Everyone who participated last year agreed that it was a good time and a chance to meet new eager sailors. Most everyone has already "re-upped" for this year's event. However, last year we had more people than boats to accommodate them. So we need more help.

Participants will sign up for an approximately 1 - 2 hour sail (depending on the wind). They also will sign a waiver and fill out a questionnaire to determine their area of interest. They will be taken to the boatyard, and directed to one of our member's participating boats. Many expect to, and want to help with the

sailing, so put them to work. At the end of the sail send them back to the person directing people at Fay's. Participants will have been instructed to wear white soled shoes, for all of you that do not need any more black streaks on your deck.

Even if you can only take one or two people out or just a couple of trips, we appreciate anything you can offer.

If you don't have a boat, we also need people to man the Sailing Awareness Day Headquarters at Fay's Boat Sales, and act as van drivers and direct people to the boats.

Sign up for participants will take place at the showroom and everyone will be transported to Fay's via van. We will start sign ups at 9:00 with the first boat to leave between 9:30 and 10:00. Thanks in advance for your help.
