Sunday, September 2, 2007

Invitation: The LWSA is pleased to invite all sailors to a special Labor Day race to take place on **Sunday, September 2nd**. We expect to have a competitive afternoon race up and down the lake followed by a social at a location to be announced at the Skippers Meeting.

Eligibility: This event is open to any skipper or owner having a boat on Lake Winnipesaukee and is looking to have an enjoyable racing sail that afternoon. Participants must meet all event requirements, and must have provided a signed waiver form before becoming official competitors. There is a fee of \$20 per boat for this event.

Rules: This event will be governed by the 2005-2008 *Racing Rules of Sailing* (RROS) *Including US SAILING Prescriptions*, this notice (except as to any modifications by the Sailing Instructions), and the current LWSA/WYC Sailing Instructions.

Classes: There will be three classes, Racing, Cruising and Cruising Spinnaker. The Class definition for a Racing boat is one that is outfitted to race or daysail while a Cruising boat is one that is set up for overnighting with full amenities below decks; Cruising Spinnaker is a Cruising Yacht that plans to fly a Spinnaker during the race. Racing boats may choose to fly a spinnaker or not. Boats will be assigned the Base Boat Handicap Rating from the PHRF New England current listings unless they have a currently valid PHRF rating on file.

Crew: It is hoped that all boats will take aboard a maximum number of crew so as to fill the boats and get as many sailors out on the lake as possible. There is a special race prize for the yacht with the most number of crew and passengers (within approved safety limits)

Entry: Each entry must be on an official form, complete with waiver of liability to be provided prior to the race. Registration and Skipper's Meeting will be held in the classroom at Fay's Boat Yard at 12:00 noon on Sunday.

Site: Racing will take place on Lake Winnipesaukee. The starting line will be in the area between Welch Island and the Gilford shore. The race will be run over as large a part of the lake as the day's conditions warrant. The planned course at this time is (1) Starting Line to Parker (2) Go around Parker - Parker to Starboard (3) Finish at Welch (finishing line same as start).

Prizes: Great "prizes" will be awarded to the top finishers in each class. The number of finishers in each class receiving prizes will be determined by the number of participants in each class - so bring a friend (or two)! The yacht with the most crew and guest in each class also receives a special prize!

Social: There will be a post race "bragging rights" party and awards ceremony at a to be announced location after the race.
